Forty years ago, advocates in Iowa were addressing what appeared to be insurmountable obstacles. People with intellectual disabilities had long lived in large institutional settings that were often far removed from family, friends, and community resources. Local leaders from the [Knights of Columbus](#), [The Arc](#), and the greater advocacy community, started the process that would ultimately result in the incorporation of Discovery Village in 1977. The objective was clear – provide people with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to live and receive individualized support services in their home community. After several years of hard work, legal wrangling, advocacy, and community outreach, [Discovery Living, Inc.](#), would open an eight-bed group home in Cedar Rapids in 1981.

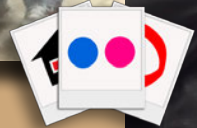
Since our humble beginning, much has changed. The people we support, their families, our employees, and board of directors have been faced with numerous funding, service delivery, and regulatory challenges. Indeed, change has been about the only constant in the delivery of services to people with disabilities. Over the course of the last 35 years, the Discovery Living family has stepped up again and again to overcome challenges, while remaining focused on quality service provision. Because of this determination to do what is right, our organization has touched thousands of lives in Eastern Iowa.

As we prepare to face the future, it is important that we reflect on not only our history, but on our mission. Rest assured that we will again step up to any challenges thrown our way and remain committed to changing more lives in the years ahead.

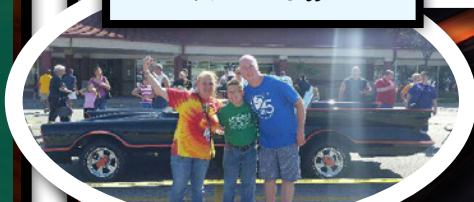

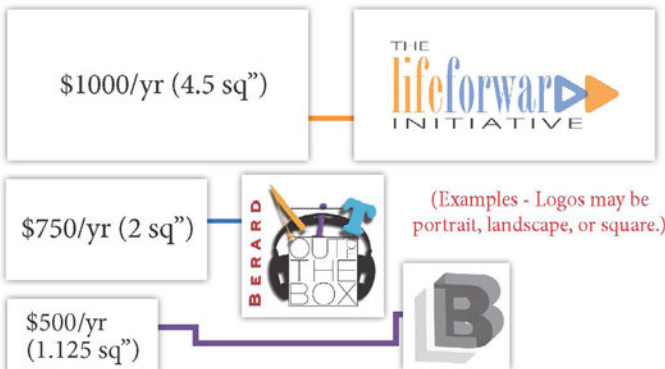

Medicaid Modernization : Implementation Delayed 60 Days

The past several issues of the Dispatch have contained updates regarding the emerging [Medicaid Modernization Initiative](#). We have done our best keep you informed regarding this rapidly evolving process, as it has unfolded. Here is where we are today:

On 12/17/15 the [Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services \(CMS\)](#) announced that the state of Iowa is not adequately prepared to implement the transition of Medicaid funded disability and mental health services to a managed care model by 1/1/16. CMS mandated that the implementation start date be pushed back 60 days, to 3/1/16. If, at that time, it is determined that Iowa is still not prepared for this transition further extensions may be mandated by CMS.

Discovery Living has been - or is - in the process of executing contracts with all approved managed care organizations (MCO's). These companies are:

- [Amerigroup Iowa, Inc.](#)
- [AmeriHealth Caritas Iowa, Inc.](#)
- [UnitedHealthcare Plan of the River Valley, Inc.](#)
- [WellCare of Iowa, Inc.](#) (Please note – On December 18th, a

state official said the bid from WellCare of Iowa should be “disqualified and the subsequent contract ... terminated.” [WellCare has stated their intention to appeal this decision.](#))

People served by Discovery Living and their representatives received notices late last year regarding their enrollment in one of these provider networks. Discovery Living is a member of all of the MCO networks, so regardless of which MCO you or the person you represent were enrolled with, you will still be able to receive support services from Discovery Living.

There has been a great deal of media attention, differing points of view, and angst regarding this initiative. We want to assure our readers that Discovery Living personnel have been active in advocacy efforts, as well as in reaching out to establish relationships with the selected managed care companies. Our focus will be what it has always been - providing high quality supports and services to members and their loved ones. ROLL OVER



On 12/21/15 President Obama signed a law, enacted by Congress, which makes the [IRA Charitable Rollover provision](#) permanent.

This law allows people who are 70½ or older to donate up to \$100,000 to a charity directly from their Individual Retirement Accounts - without treating the distribution as taxable income.

Health and Wellness (and You!)

Tips for losing weight

- Take your time when you eat
- Put down your fork in between bites
- Sip water in between bites
- Use a smaller plate, when full it feels like you’re getting more
- Have a visual to keep you motivated, a photo of yourself at a weight that you want to get to, an item of clothing that you want to buy, etc.

When eating out:

- Split a meal with someone
- Ask for a to-go box right away and save half your meal for the next day when it comes
- Be a picky eater. Don’t be afraid to ask for dressings on the side or not have the bread or cheese show up on the plate at all.

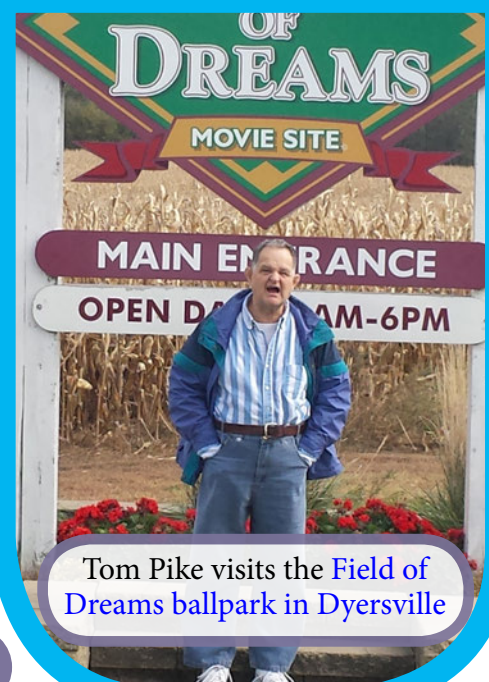


FISH TALE
