

Medicaid Modernization Update

After two delays, Iowa's Medicaid Modernization Initiative was launched on April 1, 2016. Here is where we are today:

- We have successfully billed both of our managed care partners for services provided in April and May. As you recall, Discovery Living, Inc., is part of the provider network for:
 - Amerigroup Iowa, Inc.
 AmeriHealth Caritas Iowa, Inc.
- We completed/submitted 120 health risk assessments for our members with AmeriHealth Caritas, with each member receiving a \$10 thank you Hy-Vee gift card from AmeriHealth.
- Representatives from your loved one's MCO may be calling, if you are their representative payee. If you receive a call from a managed care company representative, they may request that you verify who you are. Unfortunately, the only way for the managed care representative to verify your identity is for them to request personal information, such as date of birth, social security number, MCO ID number, etc. If you are uncomfortable sharing this information via the phone, that is fine. Not participating in this 'welcome call' will not impact the services your loved one receives. The purpose of this call is to ensure you are welcomed, received the welcome packet, and have the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.
- We have had contact with representatives from both AmeriHealth and Amerigroup. We also conducted a tour of our office and some community-based services for several members of the AmeriHealth team on 4/29/15. We will continue our efforts to ensure that services are uninterrupted during this transition. second part of our two-part series. As a quick refresher, we've already emphasized

the importance of mindful proactivity - seeing your physician routinely and aiming for early detection however, if your primary physician is not open or is unable to fit you into their schedule, you may need to visit an urgent care facility or your local hospital's emergency room. Which one?

Urgent Care

Recommended if the health issue requires immediate attention, but



is not a life threatening emergency.

Examples: Cold, cough, flu, throat

pain, ear, eye, or skin infections, a minor cut, fever without a rash, minor burns, muscle sprain or strain, a respiratory infection, bone fracture,

painful urination, persistent diarrhea, vomiting, and migraine headache.

Advantages of Urgent Care

No appointment is necessary, similar resources as your primary care facility, less expensive than an ER

Emergency Room

Recommended if the health issue is a serious, life threatening condition.

Examples: Symptoms of a heart attack or stroke, shortness Emergency of breath/ wheezing, severe pain in abdomen, coughing/vomiting blood, uncontrolled bleeding/ deep cut, severe allergic reaction, poisoning, seizure without previous diagnosis, fainting or loss of balance, head/eye injuries, broken or dislocated joint, or serious burn.

Advantages of Emergency Room

No appointment required, immediate care, open 24/7, and technology to handle serious health care emergencies.
