alking the talk is an important part of any organization's sincere attempts at building a healthy, lasting workplace culture. It was in that spirit that Discovery Living embarked on the Employee Satisfaction Survey of 2023, using the newly launched Paylocity HR system as the means of delivery. In a world of constant demands vying for our attention, engagement in any endeavor isn't easily achieved. Such was not the case when it came to this year's Employee Satisfaction Survey; a whopping 68% of our employees responded to the survey. Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond and provide your valued feedback.

The survery focussed on two overall issues: Are Discovery

Living's employees generally satisfied with their employer, and in what areas can we improve? The answer to the first question was a resounding YES. As shown in the graph below, the vast majority of employees responded favorably to questions such as "Discovery Living shows care and concern for the needs of its employees" (87% Agree or Strongly A "Discovery Living's culture is enjoyab

employees" (87% Agree or Strongly Agree), "Discovery Living's culture is enjoyable to be a part of" (90% Agree or Strongly Agree), "I enjoy performing the day to day activities" (93% Agree or Strongly Agree), "Discovery Living provides my team with information that allows us to provide quality care to the individuals we support" (93% Agree or Strongly Agree), "My job gives me a sense of personal satisfaction" (94% Agree or Strongly Agree), and "Discovery Living has a positive reputation in the community" (96% Agree or Strongly Agree).

While we received more than passing grades on 16 of the 17 survey questions (79% or more Agree or Strongly Agree), one area emerged as a clear winner for where improvement is needed. Only 68% of employees

responded they agree or strongly agree to "When decisions are made, the people affected are asked for their ideas and input."

With 31 residential homes and 3 activity center locations, communication can be a challenge and has been an area of focus for us. We recently embarked on comprehensive system upgrades with the focus of improving communication, routinely gathering input from others, and engaging our employees. We will continue to focus on improved communication and look forward to what the next year has to offer. Thanks again for helping us continue to grow and improve.




