




Discovery Living is proud to partner with the [Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation](#). The GCRCF invests funds, including those from the Discovery Living endowment, while utilizing investment earnings and tax credits to provide grants, education, and other supports to further the work of hundreds of local non-profit organizations.

The GCRCF was founded in 1949 as the Community Welfare Fund in Cedar Rapids for the purpose of receiving gifts and bequests to provide support for charitable enterprises. In 2022 the Community Foundation distributed over \$21 million in grants to 515 nonprofit organizations. The GCRCF has nearly \$200 million in assets that it utilizes to help support local non-profit organizations, like Discovery Living. In the last three years, the GCRCF has awarded our organization grant funds that allowed us to install keyless entry pads on our homes, install five whole home generators, purchase a vehicle for our Community Center, and provide critical IT upgrades.





Stroke Signals



Signs you may be having a stroke include:

- » Dizziness
- » Weakness
- » Trouble speaking
- » Vision changes
- » Loss of balance
- » Headache
- » Confusion
- » Difficulty understanding
- » Numbness
- » Trouble walking

Medicaid Waste Fraud and Abuse

Medicaid is a federal entitlement program that accounts for over 90% of Discovery Living's operational funding. In fact, 94 million U.S. citizens, and more than 800,000 Iowans, rely on Medicaid to pay for expenses related to essential services such as support services (like those provided by Discovery Living), prescription drugs, case management, physical therapy, and occupational therapy.

Given the size of the Medicaid program, all of us here at Discovery Living, and all other Medicaid recipients, are expected to ensure that Medicaid funds are appropriately utilized - and fully accounted for. Unfortunately, theft and misuse of Medicaid funds does occur. Below is data from an Office of Inspector General (OIG) report for Fiscal Year 2022 that summarizes OIG's fraud prevention efforts.

In FY 22:

- There were 1,327 convictions related to Medicaid fraud
- 1.1 billion in misused Medicaid resources were recovered
- 2,332 individuals or entities were added to the Medicaid exclusion list
- There were 533 civil settlements and recoveries related to Medicaid misuse
- 171 people were convicted of improper diversion of Medicaid provided medications

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 2022 data estimates that the federal government issued 247 billion in 'improper' payments in 2022, over \$80 billion of which was from Medicaid

Each of us plays a key role in ensuring that Medicaid resources are appropriately utilized and carefully accounted for.
