Workforce Challenges are Widespread in Disability Services


The American Network of Community Options and Resources (ANCOR) recently published The State of America's Direct Support Workforce Crisis 2023. This report highlighted labor related challenges facing people served, their families, human service organization employees, and employers – like Discovery Living. Below is data that helps illustrate this ongoing issue:

- The median hourly rate of pay for Direct Support professionals (DSP's) is \$14.40 an hour
- DSP employee turnover rates typically vary from 20% to 80%, but averaged 44% in 2023
- 95% of disability service providers indicated they had experienced moderate or severe staffing shortages in the past year.
- More than three-fourths (77%) of disability service providers reported turning away new referrals in the past year due to ongoing staffing shortages.

The above numbers are sobering and illustrate the importance of our continuing efforts to ensure that Medicaid is fully funded, and that reimbursement rates allow service providers to adequately compensate caregivers.

e are pleased to announce the addition of a practical, hands-on training lab right here in the Discovery Living office! The lab was designed to provide a safe place to strengthen our physical caregiving skills through practice and example in a simulated living environment.

The lab "opened for business" with a training for Hoyer lift use and safety. Caregivers were given the chance to become familiar with the equipment and learn such things as how it works, how to safely and securely prepare the individual for the lift, what kinds of challenges one might need to anticipate when performing such a lift in space-limited environments, what it feels like to perform the lift properly, and

even what it feels like to be lifted.

The hands-on training also provided practice opportunities with a sit-to-stand lift, gait belts, and other frequently used equipment like a blood pressure monitor, thermometer, and pulse oximeter.

The training lab will be available for employee use at any time. Other items available

for training include a manikin, affectionately nicknamed "Sammy Gene" by the first students, that features realistic anatomy and life-like features, making it as close to working

with a real person as possible. All the equipment listed above plus a hospital bed with side rails, wheelchair, shower chair, commode,

walker, and all sorts of miscellaneous medical supplies are also available for use.

Another benefit to the lab is that the area where skills can be practiced has been set up to be as similar to our individuals' settings as possible which will in turn enhance the training experience.

The ability for our employees to participate in such trainings will help



improve the skills of our caregivers and will enable a more empathetic view for what our individuals may be experiencing.

Feel free to stop by and check out the skills training lab! This is just one more way that Discovery Living is ensuring that we are giving the best possible care to the individuals we serve!
